Dear Commissioner: This directive  
amends, but does not cancel, the directive  
issued to you on December 8, 1998, by the  
Chairman, Committee for the Implementation  
of Textile Agreements. That directive  
concerns imports of certain cotton, wool,  
man-made fiber, silk blend and other  
vegetable fiber textiles and textile products,  
produced or manufactured in Indonesia and  
exported during the twelve-month period  
which began on January 1, 1999 and extends  
through December 31, 1999.

Effective on May 6, 1999, you are directed  
to adjust the limits for the categories listed  
below, as provided for under the Uruguay  
Round Agreement on Textiles and Clothing:

*Abstract:* The Compact for Reading is a written agreement between families, teachers, and principals describing how each partner will work to improve the reading skills of students in kindergarten through third grade. At each grade level, a set of 100 home learning activities is offered to improve reading skills. These activities focus on family members as home learning partners. Research shows that even though the requirement for Title I compacts is several years old, many Title I schools still do not have compacts in place, or do not use them to full advantage. The Compact for Reading evaluation will attempt to show whether implementing this type of compact will enhance student learning and therefore should be considered for adoption by other Title I schools.
